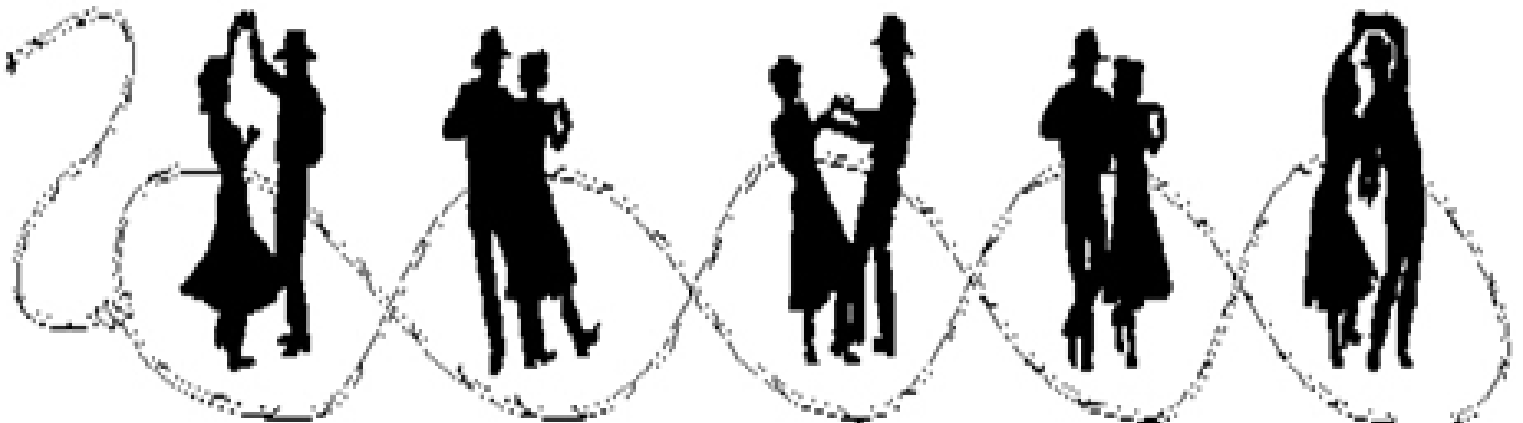

You have made plans to travel to Oklahoma City in June, haven't you? Let me sweeten your trip a little. This past week the Biltmore Hotel (hotel code 14) in Oklahoma City has decided to lower their room price for our convention. The new price is \$69 per night plus tax. The old rate was \$85. The Biltmore is almost six miles from Cox Convention Center. We highly recommend you purchase our Bus Pass for each rider. There is no free parking in downtown Oklahoma City. The Biltmore has free parking. With this savings you might consider coming early and take advantage of our pre-convention tours.

Step back in time in Historic Guthrie

Guthrie was founded on the day of the historic land run in 1889. It was the territorial capital and had visions of becoming the State Capital of the new state of Oklahoma. An election in 1910 stole that vision and moved the state seal to Oklahoma City. The site of the original capital is now the site of one of the largest Scottish Rite Temples in the US with beautiful stained glass windows throughout. The downtown area boasts over 100 buildings that are on the National Register, and you will have time to browse in the unique shops before lunch.

National Weather Center and Sam Noble Museum

Begin the day with a guided tour of the National Weather Center and Storm Prediction Center. After lunch on your own, visit the Sam Noble Museum of Natural History. The Dinosaur exhibit is outstanding!

TRANSPORTATION

TRANSPORTATION

The 62nd NSDC in Oklahoma City has a transportation contract with Kincaid Coach Line. Transportation will be done in great style with air conditioned motor coaches. We have contracted eight (8) coaches, six (6) will be dedicated to South Meridian Avenue where the majority of the hotels are. Two (2) coaches will be reserved for the RV campers at the Fairgrounds. A bus pass can be purchased for \$50.00 per dancer. The coaches will begin the run at noon on Wednesday and 8:00 am Thursday through Saturday. The last run will be at midnight. The dancers may ride the coaches from the hotels/fairgrounds to the Convention Center to pick up their registration packets, but must have a bus pass to ride back from the Convention Center to the hotels/fairgrounds. Each ride is approximately 20 minutes. In our contract we have an option to add more buses as needed. Come to Oklahoma; enjoy the fellowship as well as all the dancing.

Jump in that RV and come visit Oklahoma City. We have 300 RV spaces located just 4 miles from the Convention Center, with easy access to the Interstate.

All the spaces have water; 272 have 30 amp and 28 have 50 amp electrical service; there is a dump station on site and honey bucket service is available for a fee. Restrooms and Showers are located in the Southeast portion of the grounds.

There is a four night minimum for these sites. To register indicate RV camping on your registration form, and enclose the required fees to cover the nights that you intend to stay. Please check the appropriate boxes for the days of your stay. RV camp sites will be assigned on a first come, first served basis. If you plan to camp together, you must arrive together.

RV camping fees:

30 amp RV Space (4 day minimum) \$40 per day

50 amp RV Space (4 day minimum) \$45 per day

Dry camping \$20.00 per day

The 62nd NSDC will be operating an air-conditioned, motor coach bus service between the campground and the convention center. There will be two buses dedicated to servicing the RV campground, and they will run every 30 minutes beginning at noon on Wednesday, with the last bus leaving the convention center at midnight to return to the RV campground. Service Thursday through Saturday will commence at 8 AM, run every 30 minutes and the last bus will leave the convention center for the RV Park at midnight.

Fee for this service will be \$50 per person if ordered prior to May 1, 2013. The fee goes up to \$60 per person May 1, 2013. Dancers may ride the bus from the RV Park to the convention center to register at no charge. They must have a bus pass in their possession to ride back to the RV Park.

The State Fair Park RV Campground is located just northeast of the I-40/I-44 intersection and may be accessed from either Interstate:

From Interstate 40; take the S. Agnew exit; turn North on S. Agnew to W. Reno; travel West on W. Reno to Land Rush Street; North on Land Rush Street to the campground.

From Interstate 44; take the NW 10th Street exit; travel East on NW 10th to N May Ave; then South on N May Ave. to Black Mesa Drive; turn West on Black Mesa Drive to Land Rush Street; North on Land Rush Street to the campground.

The 62nd RV and Camping Committee will have a welcome area set up at the RV parking entrance on the East side of Land Rush Street to assign parking areas. After you check in they will escort you to your parking site.

I would suggest you come prepared for HOT!! The Cox Convention Center and Busses will have GOOD air conditioning.

Parking Passes for the 62nd NSDC

The glitch that made us cancel sales of Parking Passes during the 62nd National Square Dance Convention® has been cured. We now have 4 day parking passes, with in and out privilege, available for the 62nd June 26 -29, 2013.

The 4 day pass is \$16.00 and is good Wednesday June 26 through Saturday June 29.

The pass may be used in the Convention Center Parking Garage, Sheraton Hotel Parking Garage and the Santa Fe Parking Garage. Entry and exit is accomplished by inserting the pass into the slot at the gate of these garages (just like a hotel key).

The purchased Parking Pass will be placed in your 62nd NSDC registration packet, to be picked up at the convention registration counters.

All passes must be purchased in advance and the deadline for Purchases will be June 10, 2013.

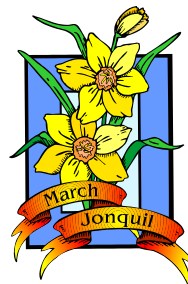
